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Important Notifications

COVID-19 Update for Early Childhood Education Care

- The Department is working with NSW Health to determine if changes regarding the use of masks will apply in line with community settings. At the current time, masks are still required indoors in ECE.
- QR codes are not required in ECE services.
- ECE services should continue to practice COVID-smart measures including maximising fresh air flow through natural ventilation, hand hygiene practices and regular cleaning.

Vaccination COVID-19, 5-11 years old

Vaccination for children 5—11 years old are now available. Evidence shows that vaccines offer better protection for children even though they experience milder symptoms than adults..

Vaccines may strengthen the immune system to protect against serious illness and possible long-term effects from COVID-19. As the vaccination rate increases, the spread of the virus also reduces.

The Pfizer (Comirnaty) children's vaccine is the approved COVID-19 vaccine for children aged 5 – 11 years in Australia. The dose is around 1/3 of the dose for people aged 12 years and older. Children will receive two doses of the vaccine, given 8 weeks apart.

You are now able to access the 2022 digital learning packs. These are designed to keep young minds busy and develop their literacy and numeracy skills.




